J3 explored the ThinkTank!

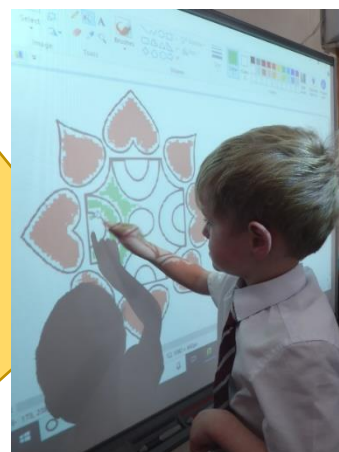

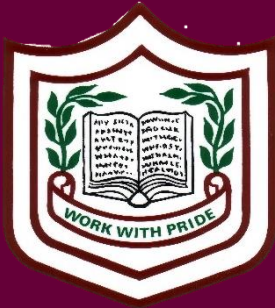


Celebrating Diwali!
