

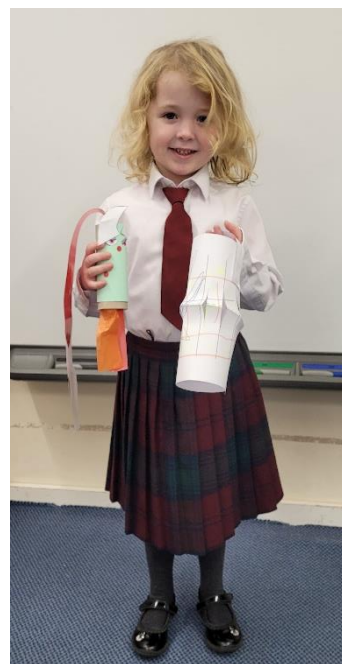


BOWBROOK NEWSLETTER
