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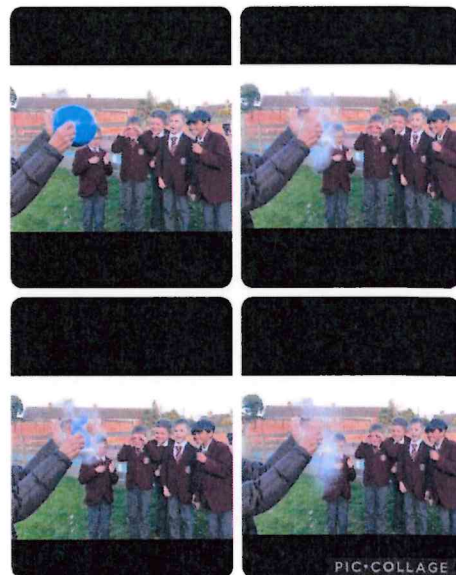
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Year 3



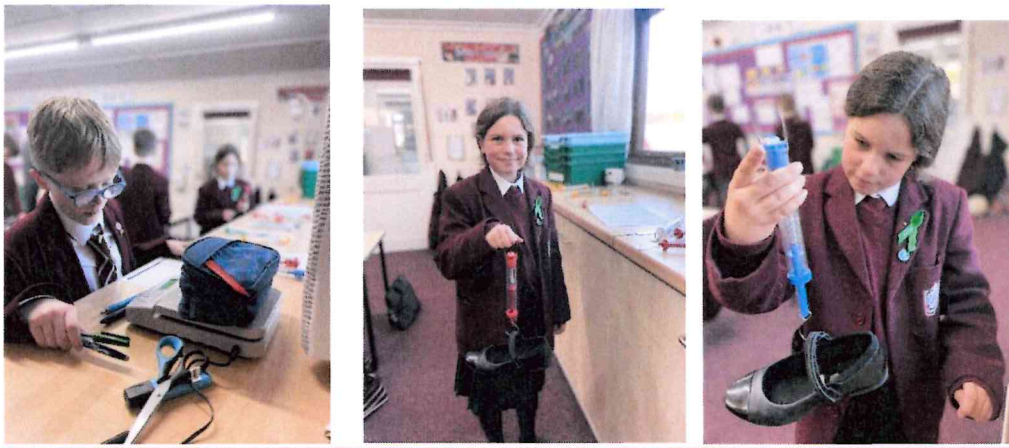
J3 have been examining different rocks and are beginning to think about where they would be found and how they have formed. They can spot sediments and understand that these are often buried deep and compacted over time to form the rocks.

Year 4



This week year 4 have been studying sound. We did an investigation to find out which travels quicker: light or sound. Popping a balloon filled with flour and watching for what they noticed first...the sight of the flour bursting out or the sound of the balloon popping.

Year 5



This week year five have enjoyed measuring the mass and weight of several common classroom items. They used equipment from the science lab which included scales to measure the mass in kilograms and a newton meter to measure the weight in Newtons.
