Knowing they had a number of runs to catch up to, the Bowbrook boys came in fully prepared to swing at the ball and earn the runs from wayward balls. There were lots of positive runs taken by the team and the boys all connected well with the ball to gain multiple 6 and 4 run boundaries throughout the innings. Whilst batting well and taking risks to gain runs, the team did have 3 wickets fall but this didn't impact the runs scored as Bowbrook totalled 287 runs to win the game.

U15's Cricket Tournament @ TDMS

Tuesday saw 8 U15 cricketers make the journey to TDMS, participating in the SWSSA powerplay cricket competition, ran by the Worcestershire cricket foundation. Competing against two teams from TDMS and two teams from Pershore, the Bowbrook boys got to grips with the different rules and set themselves up for a day of cricket.

Powerplay cricket is played in a different format with 4 balls bowled an over, 8 players on the pitch and 7 out of the 8 having to bowl. The batting order must change every game and the only position that doesn't change is wicket keeper. Bowbrook adjusted well to the first game bowling against TDMS B. Some great team work and precise bowling kept the TDMS team at 43 runs for 4 wickets and Bowbrook caught this score quickly in their innings with 47 runs scored for 0 wickets. Cameron showed his batting prowess in this innings scoring 4 sixes in the first 4 balls bowled to him in the over.

The following game was the closest game played in the afternoon with TDMS A batting first against Bowbrook. Bowbrook bowled all overs conceding 51 runs for 1 wicket and found it difficult to get bat on ball to earn the runs. A final delivery from TDMS A was deemed as wide for Bowbrook to get the win with a final score of 52 runs for 1 wicket.

The final two games for Bowbrook were against Pershore High school who also entered two teams. Bowbrook bowled Pershore B for 36 runs and 1 wicket in their innings and caught them quickly with 37 runs scored for 1 wicket. The strongest fielding display came in the final game with bowling remaining tight and Ollie reacting quickly behind the stumps. Pershore A finished their innings on a score of 25 runs for 5 wickets with the Bowbrook boys catching them with a score of 29 runs for 1 wicket.

Some excellent cricket played by all in attendance and hard work put in by the Bowbrook team, saw them collect their medals for winning the event and this puts them through to the next round, representing south Worcestershire, at Bromsgrove school later this term. Well done boys!
