U14's Football vs Kingham Hill (A)

The tone was set almost immediately. The early goal energised Bowbrook, who pressed aggressively and dominated possession from the outset.

It wasn't long before Tom doubled his tally. After some intelligent movement off the ball, he latched onto a precise through ball from Josh and calmly slotted in Bowbrook's second, giving the team a firm grip on the game. As the half progressed, Bowbrook's confidence grew, and the highlight of the opening 35 minutes came just before the break. Spotting the goalkeeper off his line, Freddie produced a spectacular volley from the halfway line, sending the ball arcing into the net for a stunning third. It was a moment of audacity and technique that capped off a highly impressive first half.

The second half saw Bowbrook maintain their momentum, pushing higher up the pitch and linking play with fluid, quick passes. Their attacking ambition soon paid off. After a flowing passing move orchestrated by James, Alfie finished neatly to make it 4–0, scoring his first of the afternoon.

The final whistle confirmed a dominant performance from Bowbrook U14s—clinical in attack, disciplined in defence, and full of confidence throughout. A 6–0 win on the road is testament to their hard work, teamwork, and growing momentum this season.
